



BS-EE DEGREE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA.



Dear Fellow Ham:

The VHF Society officers met recently and discussed Society business ranging from budgets to band plans. Work continues on the many projects undertaken this year.

The new hardware for 34/94 Salt Lake is rapidly approaching completion. Major components have been farmed out to individual hams to make the project move faster. For example, Al, KC70, is working on the transmitter, while Steve, KE7G finishes the power supply. Mike, WA7ARK, Scott, WA7UZO and John, WA7UUJ are assembling the completed parts for the new box. We have acquired a solid-state 450 repeater which will be used for the 34/94 to Snowbird link. Hopes are high to have the machine on the air in early summer.

The Tuesday night net should move a little faster now. We have pared down the preamble, smoothed out the way stations move off frequency to take check-ins from other repeaters, etc. However, the biggest problem remains the number of late check-ins. Fully 25% of those joining the net recently have been late. One of the Society officers is giving a little blurb about Society happenings right after the NCS makes the introductory statement. So, if you want to get the news, and not slow down the net, be there at eight o' clock.


Ken, K7LGP has the new, all solid-state 13/73 Riverside repeater back on the air after a winter hiatus. Transmitter output power is low to avoid a receiver "desens" problem but that will be corrected soon. The machine is very nicely balanced right now however, since you can hear it only about as far as you can work it. It runs on batteries kept charged from the AC mains so it should be a real asset in case of a commercial power failure.

#### GROUND WAVE

I was approached a while back about my newly aquired H.T. and was asked how I liked it. So here is the low down, from my point of view anyway, on the ICOM IC-2A.

I bought my IC-2A in Febuary and have really put it through it spaces. When the ever familiar brown truck arrived at the door I accepted the box with a little excitment and anticipation. I quikly opened the box and the first thing that caught my eye was the exceptionaly small size, as I handled this dollar bill sized thing I was thinking about how I could lose it in my clumsy mitts. As I layed it down I started looking to see what else this little jewel had in store for accessories. First thing that came to view was the operating manual, so, before all else fails, I thumbed through the fairly complete list of do's,don't's and how to's. As per instructions I unboxed the wall charger and proceeded with the charging for fifteen hours.

Well along came the anxious moment I had been waiting for, let's see what this thing, that has occupied my life for the last twenty-four hours can do. As I attached the ever femiliar rubber ducky antenna. flipped on the switch and low and behold a sound, after making sure all was set up for duplex operation I tried .22/.82, and some one came back to me. After a couple of QSO's I proceeded to see what else in the valley was accessable from my living room chair, I found that in addition to the 22/82 I also worked 34/74, 01/61, 16/76, 28/88, and finally the 78/18. All this was accomplished with the high power 1.5W position, so kicked it down to .15W and worked everything except the 16/76 and 78/18 machines. As most everyone does I proceeded to operate the rest of the day and then ...... Well that's when the disision came to buy another battery pack. After recieving the new pack I found that you can change packs in the middle of a QSO and only lose one or two words. I would recommend a second pack by all means especially for emergency operations. As for the battery life it's quite good,, if I had operated on low power it would have lasted a full day instead of about half a day, this is assuming a fifty percent duty cycle. I also purchased the optional speaker/mic which comes in very handy when you hang the rig on your belt.

I guess I've rambled on long enough so to sum it up in oneword FANTASTIC!!!!!


